1. Communication

1.1 Notification to External Agencies (Compliance)

- In the case of an emergency situation, Feedlot Manager will determine the need to notify external agencies and delegate responsibility to carry out actions related to notification.
- In general, the following notification requirements apply:
 - Any emergency situation involving serious injury or illness, a death or dangerous incident must be notified to WorkCover **immediately** and notified to insurer within 48 hours.
 - Any emergency situation causing or threatening to cause ‘**material harm**’ to the environment must be reported **immediately** to the **Environmental Protection Authority, NSW Health, NSW Fire and Rescue, WorkCover NSW and the Local Council.**
 - ‘**Material Harm**’ means ‘non trivial’ harm or harm that results in actual or potential loss or property damage exceeding \$10,000 including clean-up costs.
 - **Immediately** means ‘promptly and without delay’.
 - **All these authorities are to be notified; whether or not they decide to take action.** Agencies will advise on requirements once informed of nature of pollution incident.
 - If an emergency disease is suspected Feedlot Manager will contact consultant veterinarian and relevant authority through the district veterinary officer or emergency disease hotline.
 - If an excessive heat load occurs Feedlot Manager will contact the consultant veterinarian and nutritionist

1.2 Notification to Owners/Occupiers of Premises in Vicinity

The names and contact details of the owners and occupiers of land adjacent to Myola Feedlot are recorded in the Myola Emergency Action Plan. In the case of a pollution incident threatening material environmental harm owners/occupiers will be contacted as soon as practicable with regular updates made. Mechanisms for communication may include the following:

- Incident notification posted on licensees website;
- telephone calls;
- emails;
- letterbox drops; and/or
- doorknocking

Information communicated will include:

- Type of incident and risk to owners/occupiers and
- Any response required by affected persons e.g. in case of discharge of effluent to creek, warning regarding use of water for domestic purposes and/or stock watering.
